As a Reformed church, we are part of a long and enduring tradition that places worship as our highest calling. Therefore, we lean heavily on those who have gone before and see the value of creeds, catechisms, responsive readings, and other forms that are part of our heritage. However, our services are not highly liturgical, following a fixed pattern, nor spontaneous, but seek to follow a liturgical pattern that reenacts the gospel and renews us in God's grace. Rather than focusing on getting God to bless us, is focuses on the blessings, promises, and grace that we already have in Christ. Our basic gospel pattern is: We approach God based on His initiation and invitation, we see our sin and confess it, we are assured of forgiveness, we hear the good news, and we respond in faith and obedience.

Leader: Sing for joy, O heavens, and exult, O earth; break forth, O mountains, into singing!





RENEWAL | The Lord forgives his people

Confessing our Sin – Confession is a time when we are truly honest with ourselves and God, and because he knows our every thought, there is no need to pretend. Thus we confess our sin and admit that we're not what we should be, nor what we will be.

Leader: For the ways that we have strayed from your truth and neglected to listen to your voice,

People: Forgive us Lord.

Leader: For the ways that we have attempted to earn your favor and fallen flat,

People: Forgive us Lord.

Leader: For the ways that we have abused your grace, committing evil with the assumption that

we have a privileged place with you,

People: Forgive us Lord.

Leader: For the ways that we have hoarded your grace, refusing to extend it to others that have

committed wrongs against us,

People: Forgive us Lord, by the blood of your Son who, for our sake, became sin so

that in him we might become the righteousness of God. Amen.

Private Confession

Assurance of Pardoning Grace—During the assurance of pardon, God powerfully speaks to the hearts of Believers, reassuring them of His infinite love and forgiveness provided through faith in Christ.

Prayer— The prayer of intercession follows the pattern found in Scripture, as we pray for Civil Authorities (1 Tim 2:1, 2), Christian ministry and mission (Matt. 9:36-38), Salvation of all people (1 Tim. 2:3-4), Sanctification of Believers (Eph. 6:18), and the afflicted (Jm. 5:13-16).
