Updates Concerning COVID-19

Dear Covenant Family,

It goes without saying that we have all been paying close attention to the news and developments regarding the COVID-19 pandemic that is affecting large portions of the world and now our own communities. The Session has been carefully weighing options as the situation has continued to change based on latest guidelines and updates from the CDC, the state of New Jersey, and our local municipalities. We have decided that it is in the best interest of our congregation and our community to cancel services for Sunday, March 15, including Sunday school, worship, and youth group.

At this time, we are reminded of Jesus' commandment to love our neighbor (Mark 12:31). One of the ways we can do that in the midst of this pandemic is to curb the spread of the virus by practicing appropriate hygiene and social distancing. Another way is to literally care for our neighbors: ask how people are doing, what they might need help with, and how we can be in prayer. In the coming days and weeks, there will be countless opportunities to sacrificially love those around us in a spirit of boldness and humility. We pray that this will bear fruit for God's kingdom as many around us are gripped by fear, anxiety, and confusion. Remember, even if we are distant from each other, God is present and His Spirit moves with power.
