**Ask**: What made David qualified to be king? Why did God choose him? **Activity**: Play "King Tag." Whoever has the crown is it




**Jesus Connection:** How does this story point us to Jesus? How are David and Jesus related? Was David a perfect king? Is Jesus a perfect king?
