Jesus Storybook Bible*: pg. 160-169, from Jonah and Hebrews 1:1-2

Memory Verse: "Salvation comes from the Lord." (Jonah 2:9)



Activity: Try to build a boat out of different materials. Use a bathtub, water table, or even a creek nearby to see if your boat works!

Ask: What job did God have for Jonah? Why didn't Jonah want to do it?

Ask: How does God save Jonah? How does God save the people of Ninevah?

Activity: Play Hide and Go Seek. You can hide for a while, but eventually

you get found! Jonah couldn't hide from God. God still loved Jonah!



Jesus Connection: How does this story point us to Jesus? How long was Jonah in the fish? Was Jesus a Messenger? What was his message?



Prayer: Spend some time thanking God that he loves everyone and saves us through Jesus. Ask God to help you share his good news with others. Ask God for help to always run towards Him and to never run away.
