As a Reformed church, we are part of a long and enduring tradition that places worship as our highest calling. Our basic gospel pattern is: We approach God based on His initiation and invitation, we see our sin and confess it, we are assured of forgiveness, we hear the good news, and we respond in faith and obedience.

REFLECTION | God's people prepare for worship

"A great deal is entailed in being a disciple of Jesus. But the enrichment of one's whole life and the eternal welfare resulting from it, is still much greater and more glorious. PRAISE | We praise our merciful & gracious God

We confess to You, and those around us, that in doing so, we have not loved You with all our heart, soul and mind, and have not loved our neighbor as ourselves. Be gracious to us, and give us the courage to do what You have called us to. Amen
